CAP Oath:

I pledge to serve faithfully in the Civil Air Patrol program: that I will attend meetings regularly, participate actively in unit activities, wear my uniform properly, obey my officers, and advance my education and training rapidly to prepare myself to be of service to my community, state, and nation.

CAP Mission:

To serve America by performing Homeland Security and humanitarian missions for our communities, states, and nation; developing our country's youth; and educating our citizens on the importance of air and space power.

3 Missions of Civil Air Patrol:

1. An emergency services mission to provide humanitarian assistance in peacetime as well as domestic disasters, and military assistance in a national emergency.
2. A cadet program to develop and motivate the youth of the country through leadership and responsible citizenship through an interest in aviation.
3. Aerospace education of the general public in support of aerospace power.

The Snoopy Squadron Mission:

1. To organize, train, and equip a disciplined, efficient, and professional ground team for the conduct of prompt and sustained search and rescue operations.
2. To provide instruction to those cadets, so that they may gain the knowledge, skills, and character essential to become leaders in the aerospace society.

The 12 General Orders of the Interior Guard

1. To take charge of this post and all designated property in view.
2. To walk this post in a military manner, keeping always on the alert, and observing everything that takes place within sight or hearing.
3. To report all violations of orders I am instructed to enforce.
4. To repeat all calls from other posts.
5. Talk to no one except in the line of duty.
6. To receive, obey, and pass on to the sentinel who relieves me, all orders from the commander, officer of the day, and non-commissioned officers.
7. To quit my post only when properly relieved.
8. To give alarm in case of fire or disorder.
9. To call the sergeant of the guard in any case not covered by instructions.
10. To salute all colors, officers, and standards not encased.
11. To be especially watchful at night, during the times for challenging, to challenge all persons on or near the post.
12. To use no force or show no force in the execution of my duties.
